What is a Cardiac Calcium Score Screening?

It is a useful tool available for detecting heart disease in its earliest stages – even before you have any symptoms.

- The Calcium Score Screening is a non-invasive CT scan to detect calcified plaque in the coronary arteries.
- Calcified plaque is a build up of substances that can narrow your arteries and limit blood flow to your heart – possibly leading to heart disease or heart attack.
- Your calcium score tells you if you have calcified plaque in your arteries and the degree of any plaque build-up.

Who should be tested?

Certain factors increase your risk for heart disease. You should consider a Calcium Score Screening if:

- You have a family history of heart disease.
- You have high cholesterol or high blood pressure.
- You are overweight with limited exercise or activity.
- You have diabetes.
- You have a history of smoking.

Why should you be tested?

Heart disease is the number one killer for both men and women. A Calcium Score Screening:

- Helps you understand your personal risk for heart disease and complications.
- Provides you with the information you need in order to take additional steps to protect your heart health.
- Gives you the peace of mind that comes from taking a proactive approach to your own health.
